

WRITING

The Global Scale of English is transforming English teaching and learning, offering a granular, real-world measure of English language proficiency across the four skills. Some examples of what a learner can do in Writing on the GSE scale:



Can **write the letters of the alphabet in upper and lower case**



Can **use very basic connectors like and, but, so and then**



Can **write a description of a future event or activity**



Can **write a formal email/letter of thanks or apology** with appropriate conventions



Can **write a detailed description** of a complex process



Can **use basic punctuation** (e.g. commas, full stops, question marks)



Can **make simple comparisons between people, places or things**



Can **summarise the main message from simple diagrams** (e.g. graphs, bar charts)



Can **write a letter of complaint** with appropriate register, structure and conventions



Can **write a detailed critical review of cultural events** (e.g. plays, films, concerts) or literary works
